- <u>CLEENLAND</u>- household cleaning products, kitchen supplies, and bath products, and also buy-ahead grocery bulk drop-off (Cambridge)
- **<u>PEMBERTON FARMS</u>** grocery items (Cambridge)
- **<u>UVIDA</u>** one stop shopping for all your zero waste product needs (North End)
- <u>GOOD FILLING</u>- accessible and convenient refill stations for cleaning products and much more (9 locations in and around Boston!)
- **FULFILLED GOODS** refillable bulk pantry items, home goods, and cleaning supplies (Newtonville)

Here's just a few of our favorite local second hand shops:

- MAKE AND MEND- art and craft supplies (you can also donate old craft supplies here!)
- <u>SWANSON'S FABRICS</u>- a community fabric and fiber craft store stocked with the unused items of other sewers. The owner also teaches some great classes- you could learn how to make a braided rug, for instance!
- **BUY AND CONSIGN** furniture and home goods
- GARMENT DISTRICT everyday clothing as well as costumes
- <u>PLATO'S CLOSET</u>- trendy fashions in clothing, all second hand and 70% less than retail
- <u>VIVANT VINTAGE</u>- clothing, sterling silver jewelry, and other cool ephemera. They also host fun events like karaoke!
- HIGH ENERGY VINTAGE funky vintage clothing, vinyl, 90s gaming technology, music, etc.
- <u>CAMBRIDGE RASPBERRY BERET</u>- the kind you find at a second hand store I...consignment of many decades of clothes and accessories
- VICO STYLE- sustainably bougie on a budget by reclosetting vintage fashion pieces that may otherwise end up in landfills or incinerated. Did you know that VICO Style transformed what was formerly a bank ATM location into a micro vintage shop? Cool!

Mending and simple repairing skills are amazing things to learn! No time or overwhelmed? There's still lots of great options before throwing something in the trash and buying new- find a local professional! I bet there's one right in your neighborhood...
